### What we found

- 10 subscribers to the project website
  - 12 businesses visited to inform about the scheme
  - 10 comments on the interactive map
  - 1 Walk and Talk with the Violence against Women and Girls team
  - 15 residents attended a meeting for residents to give feedback on the street



### What people wanted to change



Improve feeling of personal safety



“My customers want to feel safe in this area”



Improve the appearance of Prescott Place



“We want the street to look like a cared for area”



Improve road safety



“Unsafe for pedestrians due to two-way vehicle access - travelling at speed”

### General Concerns

Some local residents expressed concerns regarding:

- Road safety, due to disjointed, cluttered and narrow pavements causing pedestrians to walk on the road
- Personal safety, due to low lighting, street layout (i.e. hidden pockets), antisocial behaviour and crime
- Poor upkeep combined with issues with littering, overflowing bins and flytipping

Some local businesses and community organisations expressed concerns regarding:

- Road safety, with some businesses describing frequent issues with road rage and narrow and disjointed pavements
- The need to maintain vehicle access to Prescott Place for deliveries
- Personal safety for employees, with some afraid to walk on Prescott Place at nighttime
