**153** surveys were completed in the Stockwell Gardens Estate

**20** businesses were visited

**71** comments were received on the Commonplace heat map

**25-30** people attended the walk and talks to inform us of their local community

### General Concerns

Some of the local residents have expressed their concerns regarding:

- Traffic levels on Landor Road as this boundary road is also shared with the now permanent low traffic neighbourhood ' Ferndale'
- Speeding and noise levels on Lingham Street
- The current crossing outside St Andrew's Primary School on Lingham Street can be changed to be more accessible
- Quiet streets becoming even more quieter due to traffic restrictions, such as Rhodesia Road & Kay Road

Some of the local businesses have expressed their concerns regarding:

- Landor Road and Clapham Road being harder to reach by vehicle due to the Healthy Neighbourhood implementation
- Businesses that require vehicle use for deliveries or heavy goods feel impacted negatively due to being harder to reach
- Lack of loading bays on Clapham Road due to TFL red route
